Perth, the capital city of Western Australia, is a modern western-style city of about 2.8 million people. The multicultural population enjoys an extensive range of high-quality facilities and a relaxed cosmopolitan lifestyle. Perth's friendly people welcome visitors and students from all over the world. Quality food and other products from around Australia and overseas are available from Perth's many shopping facilities.

Perth's wide-open spaces and pleasant Mediterranean climate (warm/dry summers and cool/wet winters) create an excellent living environment where the air is clean and traffic flows freely across the metropolitan area.

Perth is connected to major cities across the world through its proximity to south-east Asian cities including Singapore, Hong Kong, Jakarta and Kuala Lumpur. It is situated in the +8-time zone, which makes it easy for communications between Asian students and family and friends at home.

Western Australia's dynamic economy provides many career and business opportunities.

Living in Perth

The relaxed Perth lifestyle is well supported by excellent health care facilities and a clean, safe environment, as well as a stable political system. Perth has four seasons – spring (September to November), summer (December to February), autumn (March to May) and winter (June to August). Temperatures average around 10–19°C in winter and 18–32°C in summer. Students are advised to bring lightweight clothing to remain cool during the warm summer weather and appropriate warm clothing for winter. The climate supports an active outdoor lifestyle.

Cost of Living

Perth traditionally has one of the lowest costs of living of any Australian capital city. The Australian Government provides information and guidance on managing your finances. You can read more at

The average international student spends about AUD\$500–\$600 a week on accommodation, clothing, food, transport, entertainment, telephone and incidental costs. Airfares and tuition fees do not form part of this estimated cost of living.

It also does not cover additional costs associated with a more expensive lifestyle, for example, owning a car.

Part-time work is a great way to develop language skills, experience Australian culture away from campus and earn some pocket-money. Hourly rates vary (\$16–\$35 per hour) depending on the job and student's age. Students can work a maximum of 48 hours per fortnight during term time but can work full time during vacation periods. As study is the focus for students at Canning, recommended working hours are 8 to 15 hours per week – depending on course requirements. Earning income requires a student to have a Tax File Number (TFN). Students apply through the **Australian Taxation Office**.

Transport

Perth has excellent public transport which features an integrated bus and train system. Smartrider cards are issued through Canning College.

Record of Success

Canning College has assisted thousands of students to achieve entry into leading universities, including the exceptional institutions in Western Australia. The majority of Canning College students have chosen degree programs at Curtin University, The University of Western Australia and Murdoch University with others also progressing to Edith Cowan University and the University of Notre Dame Australia.

The successful completion of Canning College programs can also lead to entry into universities elsewhere in Australia. In particular, the WA Universities' Foundation Program is recognised across the country and has been a proven pathway for students seeking study opportunities at the University of Sydney, the University of Melbourne, Australian National University, Monash University, the University of Adelaide and others.

Links to Universities

Canning College has long-standing relationships with Western Australia's excellent universities. Students can package their Canning College program with The University of Western Australia, Curtin University, Murdoch University and the University of Notre Dame, Australia using the **Simplified Student Visa Framework (SSVF)**.

The advantages of packaged pathways for students include:

1. Certainty of placement after completing a pre-university course.
2. Single visa for the entire study period.
3. Quicker and easier student visa application processes.

Full details of packaged pathway arrangements are available upon application. Universities may apply special conditions for SSVF packages. Students should be aware of university withdrawal/transfer/release policies.

Canning pathways can be designed for the personal requirements of individual students and may include some, or all, of the following components: English Language Intensive Course for Overseas Students (ELICOS), Bridging, the WA Universities' Foundation Program, Certificate IV in University Access Program, Diploma of Commerce and a linked university undergraduate course.

Canning College works with English language schools including Perth International College of English (PICE) and Phoenix Academy.

It is important to note that only students studying Bridging Programs, WAUFP, Certificate IV in UAP or the Diploma of Commerce are eligible to apply for SSVF packaging. Students studying school level courses (Year 10, 11 and 12 WACE) cannot apply to package with any higher education level program.

STUDENT SERVICES

Canning College offers a range of quality student support services, all of which are included in the course fee. There are no additional charges for Canning College services.

- Excellent library facilities
- Access to high-quality computer resources and Wi-Fi network
- Learning Centre with free extra tuition
- Recreation Centre and gymnasium
- Specialised English support services and intervention programs for 'at risk' students
- Student Services Office – specialist staff and services
- Airport reception and transfers (free of charge on initial arrival)
- Special support for students under 18 years of age
- Parent liaison and online access to student reports
- Orientation programs
- Music room
- Prayer room
- Student experience activities
- Accommodation services
- Pastoral care services with trained advisors and college psychologist
- On campus cafeteria and access to food preparation facilities

As the college campus is located adjacent to Curtin University, Canning students can also enjoy some of Curtin's services. These include a medical centre, stadium, library, cafes, bookshop, free local area bus and Curtin Bus Station.

Airport Meeting Service

As it can be challenging for students arriving in a new country for the first time, Canning College can arrange for students to be greeted on arrival at Perth International Airport. They will be transported to their accommodation free of charge on their initial arrival to Perth. This service also includes students with homestay arrangements through Australian Homestay Network (AHN). Arrangements for airport pick up and accommodation must be made through the College's Student Services prior to student arrival in Perth.

Orientation

All new students are required to attend the compulsory Orientation program which provides them with crucial information and advice that will assist them in adjusting to the living and learning environment of the College and Perth. Students also receive help with opening bank accounts, registering medical insurance, obtaining student/concession cards and accommodation advice. Students will receive advice on choosing their subjects during Orientation and will receive their timetables prior to the first day of class.

The Orientation is also a good opportunity to meet fellow students and the staff at Canning College. The costs for being met at the airport (on initial arrival to Perth), all activities and lunch during the Orientation program are covered by the College.

Learning Support

In addition to formal classes, Canning College provides opportunities for additional assistance through optional tutorials or individual assistance. There is no additional charge for this service.

The Learning Centre, based in the Library, enables students to get individual or small group assistance from subject specialist teachers.

Canning also provides intervention support activities for students identified as 'at risk'.

Counselling

The College provides confidential counselling and advisory services to assist students with:

- study skills
- course information and subject selection
- career and vocational advice

A trained psychologist is available by appointment to provide advice on personal issues. Student Services also has advisors trained in assisting international students.

ACCOMMODATION

Accommodation is an important aspect of student life and must be organised before arrival. Canning College aims to ensure that all students are comfortably and safely housed so they can focus on their studies. Accommodation services include:

- providing information on a variety of types and prices of accommodation
- advising on all aspects of accommodation in Perth
- liaising with Australian Homestay Network as required

Accommodation Requirements for Students Under 18 Years of Age

The Department of Home Affairs requires students who are under the age of 18 years to have appropriate arrangements made for their welfare in Australia. Details are available on the **Department of Home Affairs website**.

Placement with Australian Homestay Network

For students under 18 years of age who require homestay, Canning College works with **Australian Homestay Network (AHN)** to arrange placements.

Homestay provides students with a secure and family-like environment. Students are encouraged to join in with the family as it provides an excellent opportunity to practise English and learn about the Australian way of life. The family provides meals and assists with everyday needs such as laundry and cleaning, allowing more time for study. More information is available on the AHN website: **www.homestaynetwork.org**

Students can also stay with a direct family relative. This must be approved by the Department of Home Affairs using a **157N form**.

On-Campus Accommodation

Canning College students over the age of 18 have access to the same on-campus accommodation options as Curtin University students. All accommodation is furnished and includes on-site management. Most on-campus accommodation is made up of single rooms or six/eight-bedroom self-contained units.

The Curtin options are:
St Catherine's College
Erica Underwood House
Guild House
Kurrajong Village
Vickery House
Twin Dolphin Hall

Of all of the options listed, Vickery House is the closest to Canning College classrooms. Each of the self-catering units house 6-8 students of the same gender. The units are within easy walking distance of Canning College, shopping centres and public transport. Students have their own furnished single bed/study room and share the kitchen, living and washing areas. Students must be at least 18 years of age to take up residence. Resident parking is available free of charge.

Rental Properties - Houses, Units and Apartments

Students over 18 years of age who wish to have independent living arrangements can rent accommodation. Most students who choose this option will share with other students. Sharing arrangements may involve from two to eight people. There are numerous rental properties within close walking distance of the College, and the Accommodation Officer will provide students with help and advice regarding this type of accommodation.

TEACHING

Canning's teachers are highly qualified, experienced and dedicated to student success. All staff are registered with the Teacher Registration Board of Western Australia.

As Canning College focuses on preparing students for university studies, teaching styles include teacher directed and student-centred activities. The aim is to ensure that all Canning graduates are independent learners and are capable of successfully engaging with university-level learning. Students are encouraged to be active learners in all class activities. Teaching staff are available to students out of class time.

Online and Library resources are available in each subject and students are expected to carry out self-directed study activities.

Learning Facilities

All classrooms have air-conditioning and are fitted with modern teaching resources such as multimedia projectors, smart boards, interactive screens and computers.

English is the language of instruction in all classes and students are encouraged to speak in English to improve their English language skills.

Assessments

At the beginning of each program, students are issued with the assessment guide for each subject. Final marks can only be derived from publicised assessment activities. Assessments are cumulative and continuous for the duration of each subject. Final results are expressed in percentage and/or grade form.

Student Ambassadors

Canning College selects up to three students each year to act as Ambassadors for the student group. The Ambassadors are selected through a process of self or teacher nomination with assessment conducted by the Principal, Deputy Principals and Heads of Learning Areas.

The Ambassadors communicate student ideas to College staff to ensure they are represented during decisions regarding student activities or experiences.

Ambassadors may also be involved in activities associated with the general business of the College, such as assisting with campus tours or ushering guests at formal functions.

Canning College also selects a Student Representative on the Board. This student will learn about the business of the College by attending board meetings throughout the year. He or she assists the Board to better understand the specific needs of the student group.

Global Student Program

The Global Student Program (GSP) aims to provide unique opportunities that assist students in negotiating an important phase of their lives and help them better understand their place in the world. By working closely with Western Australia's leading universities and partner organisations, such as StudyPerth, Canning College offers leading students a series of activities, workshops and experiences to help them push the boundaries of their personal comfort zone.

The GSP helps students to develop and enhance positive thinking, cope with the stresses of study and approach challenges with confidence and optimism. It also gives students opportunities to network with industry officials and other students to better prepare them for the adjustment to university life. The program is designed to help enthusiastic individuals develop their potential as young people, while building a strong connection to Western Australia.

SECONDARY LEVEL PROGRAMS



YEAR 10 SECONDARY STUDIES

CRICOS Course Code: 097570G

The Year 10 curriculum provides a pathway into Year 11. The curriculum focuses on literacy and numeracy and is designed to integrate the four major learning areas of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM). The Year 10 program promotes creative, independent and critical thinking.

SUBJECTS

- English (English as an Additional Language or Dialect)
- Mathematics
- Science
- Humanities and Social Sciences
- Health and Physical Education

Students will also engage in student experience activities.

Entry Points

Students can start the Year 10 program in January and April each year.

Subjects are delivered in modules that are completed in a single term. As modules are delivered independently, students can also start this program in Term 3 and Term 4 under certain circumstances.

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION (WACE) - YEAR 11

The successful completion of the WA Certificate of Education Year 11 program guarantees student entry into the WA Universities' Foundation Program, WA Certificate of Education Year 12 or Certificate IV in University Access Program.

The Year 11 program is structured around the compulsory subject Year 11 English as an Additional Language or Dialect (EAL/D). This subject is studied for nine hours each week for the duration of the program. Students must also study a Mathematics subject.

All students will develop their library and independent learning skills as part of Year 11 EAL/D. This is an important part of the program, giving an excellent introduction to research skills including the internet, online databases and referencing.

The top performing Year 11 student may be eligible for a \$3,000 scholarship to be offset against the cost of further studies at Canning College.

SUBJECTS

Students will study the compulsory subjects:

- Year 11 English as an Additional Language or Dialect (9 hours per week)
- Mathematics Applications or Mathematics Methods (4.5 hours per week)

Students also select at least three electives each semester.

Electives

- Accounting and Finance
- Business Management & Enterprise
- Chemistry
- Computer Science
- Economics
- Human Biology
- Mathematics Specialist
- Physics
- Psychology

Students will also engage in student experience activities.

Some subjects are only available in one semester. All subjects are internally assessed. Students will receive a Statement of Progress after eight weeks and College reports at the end of each semester, which will indicate their progress and level of achievement.

WESTERN AUSTRALIAN CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATION (WACE) - YEAR 12

Although most international students find the WA Universities' Foundation Program to be the ideal pathway to university, some choose to enrol in the Year 12 Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) program instead. University entry is based on a student's Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) which is a percentile ranking based on achievement in the WACE ATAR program.

The WACE is the program by which domestic Western Australian students qualify for entrance to tertiary institutions. It is similar to the WA Universities' Foundation Program but does not specifically address the needs of international students.

Students who choose the WACE program at Canning College are also required to have completed some Year 11 units (or equivalent). All students are required to complete the compulsory subject of English as an Additional Language/Dialect (EAL/D), plus four or five subjects from the list.

ATAR IS AN INTERNATIONALLY RECOGNISED UNIVERSITY ENTRY QUALIFICATION.

* English as an Additional Language / Dialect (EAL/D) is normally available only to students whose first language is not English and who have not lived in an English-speaking country for more than 7 years.

On the satisfactory completion of Year 11 and Year 12, students are awarded a Western Australian Certificate of Education. Successful completion requires meeting **Online Literacy and Numeracy Assessments (OLNA) standards. Entry into Western Australian, Australian and overseas universities will depend on the ATAR achieved. BRIDGING PROGRAMS

CRICOS Course Code: 093064C

Canning College offers a range of Bridging Programs for students requiring academic and/or English language upgrading prior to entering an academic program. This is an important component focusing on developing students' listening, speaking, reading and writing. Students select English and 4 other subjects. The content ranges from Year 10 to Year 11 levels and the emphasis is on preparing students for higher level programs. Subjects selected vary according to the program and the student's individual needs. Bridging programs range in length from 1 term to 4 terms (10 to 40 teaching weeks).

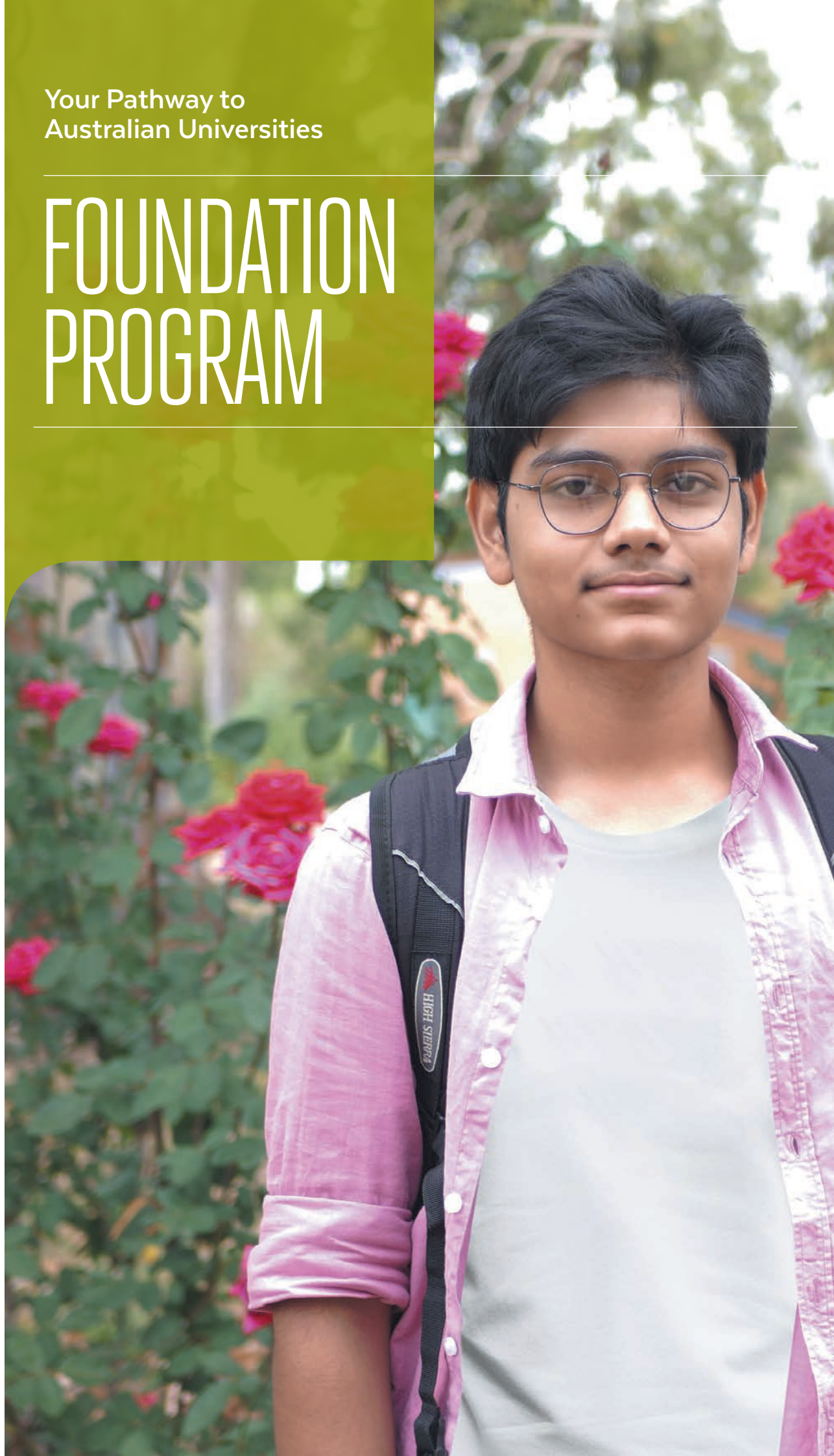

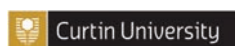
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FOUNDATION PROGRAM



WESTERN AUSTRALIAN UNIVERSITIES' FOUNDATION PROGRAM (WAUFP)

CRICOS Course Code: 113589D



Designed in 1992, for the specific needs of international students, the WAUFP is a proven university entry program. Canning College is the largest and most successful provider of the WAUFP, assisting students from around 40 countries to enter leading universities.

The program is provided on behalf of the Western Australian public universities – The University of Western Australia, Curtin University, Murdoch University and Edith Cowan University – and is managed by the Tertiary Institutions Service Centre (TISC).

Students successfully completing the WAUFP can access a range of undergraduate programs at institutions in Perth, namely Curtin University, The University of Western Australia, Murdoch University, Edith Cowan University and the University of Notre Dame Australia, as well as highly regarded programs at other Australian universities and some overseas institutions.

Canning College is registered by the Western Australian Department of Education to provide senior secondary programs and the WAUFP.

On the successful completion of the WAUFP, students are guaranteed entry into a Western Australian university if they have also:

1. Achieved 50% or higher in English Language and Australian Cultural Studies. Some courses at university require a score of 60% or higher in ELACS.
2. Achieved the required Combined Percentage Score (CPS) set by the university.
3. Completed prerequisite subjects set by the university.

Exceptions to this guarantee apply to courses with special entry requirements and quota, for example, medicine, dentistry and veterinary science.

Students can start the WAUFP in January, April and Mid-Year allowing them to achieve university entry sooner.

Recent Achievement

In 2023, 74.5% of students studying the WAUFP with Canning College achieved the required overall score for university entry, including meeting the literacy standard.

Subjects

All students are required to take the subject English Language and Australian Cultural Studies (ELACS). To gain a Combined Percentage Score (CPS) for university entrance, students must select at least 3 other elective subjects. Students may select a maximum of 4 electives. Students choosing Mathematics Specialist must also study Mathematics Methods.

Students in the standard January and Mid-Year intakes receive 9 hours per week of tuition in English Language and Australian Cultural Studies (ELACS) and 4.5 hours per week in other subjects.

Students in the April intake receive an extra hour per week of tuition in each unit (other than ELACS). At the time of the final examinations in November, students in the April intake will have had approximately the same total tuition hours as those who commenced in the January intake.

Assessments

School assessments account for 50% of the final score. The final school mark/grade for each unit is based on continuous and cumulative assessments. Assessment activities approved by the Tertiary Institutions Service Centre (TISC) include tests, internal examinations, laboratory reports, essays, assignments, projects and oral presentations. The other 50% is from external exams set by TISC. Final results are issued by TISC and university offers of place are issued by mid-December each year.

Each student receives progress reports, statement of final College results and a WAUFP results statement. Keeping track of academic progress is made easy as students can access marks online.

The calculation of the Combined Percentage Score (CPS)

The CPS can be calculated in two ways:

- The average of the best three scaled scores (excluding ELACS) OR
- The average of the best four scaled scores (including ELACS)

TISC will use the calculation which provides the highest result for each student.

Intakes

January Entry WAUFP – the standard program where students receive 9 hours per week of tuition in English Language and Australian Cultural Studies and 4.5 hours per week in other subjects. This program is suitable for all students who meet minimum entry requirements.

April Entry WAUFP – is an accelerated course. Students do extra hours each week, have fewer vacation weeks and sit the final examinations with January Entry students in November.

Mid-Year Entry WAUFP – is a standard Foundation program linked to mid-year entry at university. The program is a full academic year. Classes commence in July and students sit the final examinations in May of the following year.

Recognition

The Certificate IV in University Access Program is a one semester pre-diploma program and an accelerated university entry program. It provides ideal preparation for further studies at diploma or first year university level. It is a Level Four Course on the Australian Qualifications Framework.

Articulation

Successful completion of the Certificate IV program provides a guaranteed place in Canning's Diploma of Commerce.

Successful students can also apply for first year undergraduate entry to a range of degrees at Curtin University and Murdoch University with ATAR requirement of 70 (with no prerequisites). In addition to completing the Certificate IV, students will also need to meet each university's undergraduate English requirement. Some degrees, such as nursing, have additional English requirements. Students wanting admission to The University of Western Australia must do so through completion of Canning's Diploma of Commerce UWA Stream.

Program Structure

The program is two 10-week terms and entry is in January/February and July each year. There is usually a 2-week vacation period between each 10-week tuition period.

All students also receive one hour of Subject Support per week, which includes advice on study skills, referencing, presentation, memory skills and exam preparation.

Credit for Recognition of Prior Learning

Canning College recognises prior learning by acknowledging competencies and outcomes achieved (skills, knowledge and attributes) as a result of formal training and education (both within Australia and overseas), work experience and/or life experience. Students who have successfully completed similar units of study at another institution may be given credit or exemption for a module in the Certificate IV program.

Assessment

Each unit has a course outline and assessment structure. Students are given this information on commencement. Final results are determined by performance in all assessment activities. Competency Based Assessment is the process of collecting evidence and making judgements as to whether a competency has been achieved. Assessment in each unit is continuous and includes one exam per term. Most units will be assessed through a combination of written examinations and coursework, which may include group-based assignments, research assignments, presentations and practical work. Students who successfully complete the course receive a Record of Results and the Certificate IV in UAP award at the annual graduation ceremony. Students who achieve partial completion of the Certificate IV in UAP will be issued with a Statement of Attainment.

Scholarships

Canning College offers a number of academic awards based on applicants' results from their home country. Scholarships of AUD\$3,000 each can be awarded to top students commencing the Certificate IV program.

DIPLOMA OF COMMERCE

The Diploma of Commerce UWA Stream and Diploma of Commerce Curtin Stream are equivalent to first year Bachelor of Commerce at The University of Western Australia, Curtin University, Murdoch University and the University of Notre Dame Australia. On successful completion of the Diploma, students will articulate into year 2 of the Bachelor degree.





Accreditation

Canning College is a Registered Training Organisation (RTO) with the Training Accreditation Council in Western Australia. The Diploma of Commerce UWA Stream and Diploma of Commerce Curtin Stream are accredited courses through the Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA). The two diplomas are Level 5 qualifications within the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) www.aqf.edu.au

Articulation

Students are offered the choice of two courses in the Diploma Program:

- The Diploma of Commerce UWA Stream: 52903WA CRICOS Course Code: 114078H
- The Diploma of Commerce Curtin Stream: 52902WA CRICOS Course Code: 114077J

The Diploma courses are equivalent to first year university in terms of their course content and academic structure. Units are studied over two semesters, with annual intakes in February and July. Successful completion of the Diploma guarantees international student entry into the second year of Bachelor of Commerce at The University of Western Australia, Curtin University, Murdoch University and the University of Notre Dame Australia. Completion of the Diploma may also lead to second year at other universities, subject to a university's individual assessment.

Canning College Entry Scholarships

Each year AUD\$5,000 scholarships are offered by Canning College for students enrolling into the Diploma course. Awards are based on academic merit as demonstrated by the applicants' performance in entry programs studied overseas or within Australia.

Credit for Recognition of Prior Learning

Canning College recognises prior learning by acknowledging competencies and outcomes achieved (skills, knowledge and attributes) held as a result of formal training and education (both within Australia and overseas), work experience and/or life experience. Students who have successfully completed similar units of study at another institution may be given credit/exemption for a module in the Diploma of Commerce.

Small Class Sizes

There are real advantages in being part of a small and select program. The small class sizes ensure that students receive attention from the highly skilled lecturers, who get to know the students better. Being part of a small group allows students to feel comfortable asking questions and to be confident with their peers.

Additional Support

Students receive additional support of up to 90 minutes per week through Uni Ready Skills. During these sessions, students learn presentation skills, exam preparation, study techniques, referencing and other skills that better prepare them for university.

Semester Organisation

The Diploma of Commerce is offered over two semesters. This closely follows university academic calendars. The study program includes at least two weeks free from class in mid-semester and a study week just prior to final exams. These breaks allow students to be fully prepared for assignments, tests and examinations.

Lectures

Lectures provide students with the structure and content of a unit. Students are expected to make their own notes summarising the key points covered in the lectures.

Tutorials and Seminars

Tutorials and seminars usually involve a small group of students and a member of the teaching staff. They provide an opportunity for further consideration of topics and questions regarding any complicated issues that have been covered in lectures. Students are encouraged to participate actively and positively during discussions through individual and/or group presentations. These active learning activities help prepare students for university-style learning and workplace tasks.

Laboratory Work

Computer based laboratory work forms another essential part of teaching and learning and is employed widely in Business Information Systems and Business Statistics. It gives students the opportunity to apply their knowledge and develop practical skills - useful for higher level learning and workplace tasks.

Private Study

Students are expected to do private study on a regular basis to support their lectures and seminars. All resources are provided and easily accessible at Canning College. The library caters for university level students. Private study contributes to the development of time management skills and the ability to work unsupervised - both highly valued in a workplace.

Assessments

Competency Based Assessment is the process of collecting evidence and making judgements as to whether competency has been achieved. Continuous Assessment is a feature of the program which means that student work is being assessed on an ongoing basis. The assessment system and final results are managed by a Board of Examiners. Performance is carefully monitored during the course and regular feedback is given during the weekly individual consultations with the course tutors.

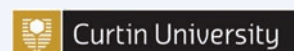

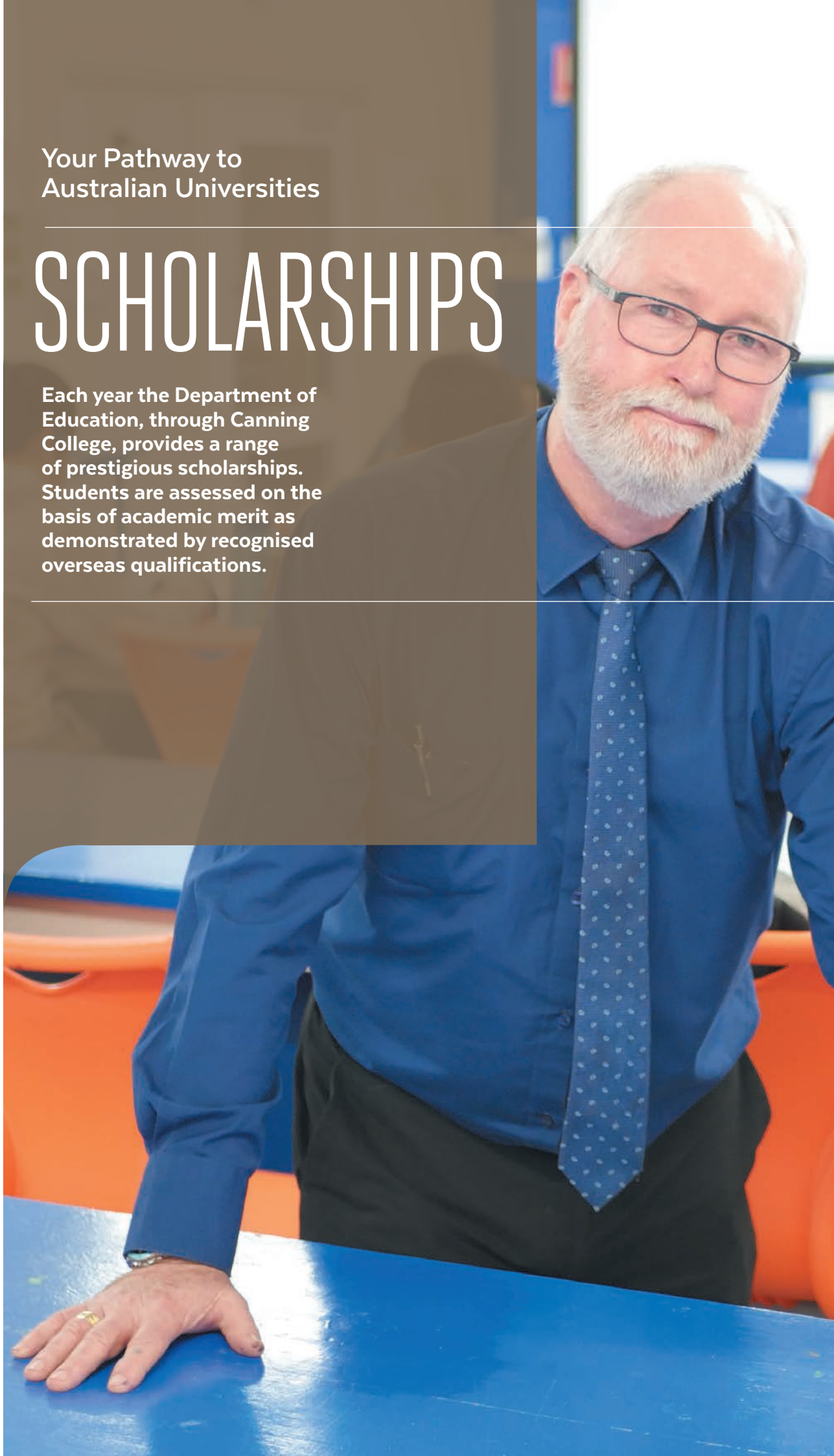

Receiving an offer

You will receive an offer via your International Education Agent with payment summary and acceptance instructions.

Accepting your offer

Read and agree to all conditions and the Terms of the Offer as outlined in your Canning College Letter of Offer. On receipt of the fees, and all signed acceptance documents, Canning College will issue the electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (eCoE). The Australian Government requires every international student to have medical insurance for the period of the student visa. This can be organised by Canning College through Bupa Australia, or through your International Education Agent.

Accommodation and welfare arrangements for under 18 aged students must be confirmed when accepting your Canning College offer.

ENROLMENT INFORMATION

Visa Conditions

All enrolments at Canning College comply with Department of Home Affairs regulations. Further information regarding student visas is available from the Department of Home Affairs website: www.homeaffairs.gov.au.

Visas are usually issued for the period of the course(s). Students must leave Australia or apply for a new visa before the expiration of the current visa.

Canning College is required to report, to the Department of Home Affairs, any student in breach of visa requirements such as unsatisfactory attendance or academic progress.

Deferment

Any student wishing to defer enrolment to a later semester must apply to Canning College in writing. Circumstances where deferment will be considered include education matters, medical issues, personal and family matters. If the deferment is approved, Canning will hold and transfer all fees to the new semester without any penalty. Deferment can be for a maximum of two semesters. If the student subsequently withdraws from the course, the Refund Policy will be applied from the date Canning College was advised of the withdrawal.

The Department of Home Affairs will be informed accordingly.

Leave of Absence

Any student wanting to take a leave of absence must apply in writing to Canning College. If leave is approved, there is no financial penalty, to a maximum of two weeks. After two weeks, deferment arrangements will apply. If a student applying for special leave is under 18 years of age, then, the application must be supported, in writing, by the student's parent(s) or legal guardian. If an under 18 aged student wishes to travel outside of Perth, approval must be sought from the College and arrangements supported by the parent(s) or legal guardian.

Urgent Medical Treatment

In circumstances where the student requires urgent medical attention and it is not possible to contact a parent/custodian/local carer, Canning College is authorised to arrange appropriate medical care.

Regulatory Framework

As a government international school, Canning College operates within a diverse regulatory framework, including the Schools' Education Act 1999 and the Education Services for Overseas Students (ESOS) Act 2000 and associated National Code. Information regarding the ESOS Act and National Code is available on the Australian Department of Education website.

Transfer Policy

In accordance with government regulations, including the **National Code Standard 7** (Overseas student transfers), Canning College expects students to complete the program in which they are enrolled. This includes the completion of Simplified Student Visa Framework (SSVF) arrangements.

However, the College recognises that there may be educational or exceptional personal circumstances which require students to change provider. In such cases, applications to transfer and receive a letter of release will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Students are required to submit a copy of any offer from another provider and submit a written application for release.

Canning College will support students' education and personal interests, and a letter of release will be issued on such grounds.

For students on SSVF packages, release will be required from the university (the principal provider) with which the package (and visa) is linked. Be sure to check the policy of the relevant university.

Canning College will not enrol any students who are in breach of regulatory requirements relating to transfer between registered providers. Further information regarding **changing courses/providers** is available on the Australian Government website here: www.studyaustralia.gov.au.

Further information regarding **National Code Standard 7** (Overseas student transfers) is available on the **Australian Department of Education** website.

Medical Insurance

Every international student is required to have medical insurance for the period of the student visa. This is a regulation imposed on every student by the Department of Home Affairs and is defined in **mandatory condition 8501**.

Medical insurance (Overseas Student Health Cover) is provided by Bupa and the current rate is AUD\$791 per 12-month period (subject to

changes by Bupa). Prorated premiums apply to longer or shorter courses. Students with package visas must pay the premium which covers the entire visa/study period.

The OSHC helps pay for medical and hospital care that students may need whilst studying in Australia and will contribute towards the cost of most prescription medicines (up to applicable limits) as well as medically necessary ambulance transport. Further information regarding medical insurance is available on the Bupa website.

Suspension or Cancellation of Enrolment

Canning College has the right to suspend or cancel a student's enrolment or re-enrolment in response to any breaches of attendance, academic progress and / or behaviour requirements. Under the Education Services for Overseas Students (ESOS) Act 2000, Canning is required to report such instances to the Department of Home Affairs.

Any action is subject to internal and external (including Western Australian Ombudsman) appeal processes. Detailed information is issued in the acceptance documents. Canning College exclusion processes comply with WA Department of Education requirements.

Students who self-cancel enrolment/student visa should seek advice from Student Services and the Department of Home Affairs about other visa options.

Further information regarding **National Code Standard 9** (Deferring, suspending or cancelling the overseas student's enrolment) is available on the **Australian Department of Education** website.

Attendance

Canning College encourages all students to maximise attendance as it is key to academic success.

Students are expected to maintain a satisfactory level of attendance and comply with Australian government requirements (attend at least 80% of scheduled classes).

The attendance rate is calculated by dividing the number of classes attended by the total number of scheduled classes (including examinations), expressed as a percentage. Students encountering problems with attendance may be placed in a student management program.

REFUND SCHEDULE

Conditions for Applying for a Refund

The following refunds apply:

- a) Student is denied a visa by the Australian Government. No written agreement applies: refund of all course fees less an administration fee of up to AUD\$500. This does not apply to students who have already commenced online studies.
- b) Student withdraws or transfers more than 10 weeks before the program commences. Refund of all course fees paid less an administration fee of up to 10% or AUD\$1000.00, whichever is less.
- c) Student withdraws or has enrolment arrangements cancelled due to not meeting English language requirements after undertaking linked ELICOS studies, refund of all course fees paid less an administration fee of up to 10% or AUD\$1000.00, whichever is the lesser.
- d) Student loses Good Standing status due to failure to comply with attendance, behaviour or subject work requirements (including meeting assignment deadlines, sitting for scheduled tests and examinations); all course fees for the current semester are forfeited and standard refund policy conditions are applied to any subsequent semesters, from the date of termination.
- e) Where a student has paid a deposit for a package principal course at Canning and withdraws after completing the preliminary course and prior to commencement of the principal course, the deposit will be refunded less an administration fee of up to 10% or AUD\$1,000.00, whichever is less.
- f) This agreement (policy) does not remove the right of the student or College to take further action under Australia's consumer protection laws or general legal processes.
- f) Any refund will be issued within seven working days of the student submitting all clearance documents. Refunds will be made according to instructions from the person who confirmed/accepted the student's enrolment and arranged for payment of fees.
- h) Applications for refunds must be in writing and addressed to the Director, International Operations.
- i) If the nominated course is unable to be provided by the College, then, fees paid will be refunded in full or alternative comparable placements arranged.
- j) Student withdraws or transfers:

CONDITIONS OF APPLICATION / ENROLMENT

1. Tuition Fees

Tuition fees are reviewed annually. Fees for the subsequent year will be published in the latest Canning College Prospectus. Additional tuition fee payments can be made at any time.

Tuition fees must be paid prior to the start of each semester. Fees and Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) are to be paid at least two weeks prior to the commencement date of the course. All payments are to be made in Australian dollars and payable to Canning College. The Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) will then be issued and visa procedures may be completed. You must ensure payments are made in accordance with the regulations to ensure you maintain a valid enrolment.

Where programs are less than 20 weeks in length, the entire fee must be paid prior to enrolment being confirmed.

Where programs are more than 20 weeks in length, fee payment is to be made in two instalments related to two study periods. The first study period is the first semester of the academic program. The second study period is the second semester of the academic program. 50% of fees two weeks prior to the commencement of the second study period.

Late payment of fees – A \$200 penalty fee may apply to any fees required two weeks after the due payment date.

2. Orientation

As a new student you are required to attend the Canning College orientation session which will provide you with important information regarding your studies including timetable, assistance available to you and information about life in Western Australia.

Information about your orientation will be emailed to you approximately four weeks before you are required to commence. Orientation information can also be obtained by contacting the College on Canning.Col.Admissions@education.wa.edu.au.

3. Accommodation

The College will assist students in finding suitable accommodation for the enrolment period. This service provided by Canning College is included in the program fee. Otherwise students under 18 are required to use the services of Australian Homestay Network (AHN) unless staying with approved family. Canning College students over the age of 18 have access to the same on-campus accommodation options as Curtin University students, including Vickery House which is located on the boundary of Canning College campus.

4. Care and wellbeing of students aged under 18

For the care and well-being of under 18 aged students, they are required to adhere to the College's policy and procedures. Additional information is available from Student Services. Any change in welfare or accommodation arrangements must have prior approval from Canning College and parent(s)/legal guardian. Canning College is authorised to provide parents with information regarding behaviour, attendance and academic progress.

5. Attendance at excursion

The student may attend any excursion organised and approved by College staff as part of the orientation, teaching/learning or recreation programs. For students under 18 years of age, a permission form must be signed by the parent(s), guardian or carer.

6. Urgent medical care

In the event of circumstances requiring urgent medical care and it is not possible to contact the parent/guardian, the College is authorised to seek and provide appropriate medical treatment. Any important medical information will be provided to the College.

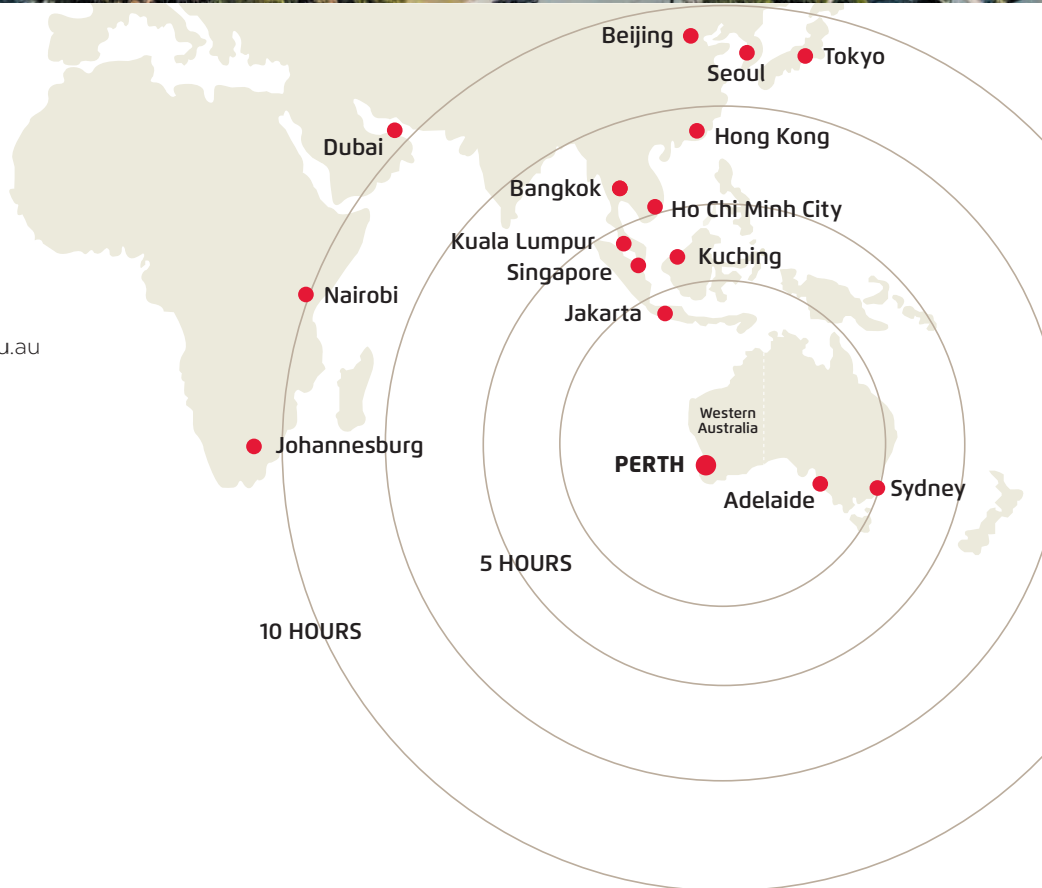
